day of August in the year of our Lord one
thousand eight hundred and forty nine
before me William W. Fayler a Notary Public
and commissioner and sworn, residing in
the City of New Bedford aforesaid, personally
appeared Alexander Wilson master of the
Ship Acadia of New Bedford of the burden
of 581 tons or thereabouts now lying in the
harbor of New Bedford aforesaid and states
that he sailed from Calcutta on the 20th day of
April last past with a cargo consisting of
Linnseed, Gunny bags, Rattans and other
merchandise bound for New Bedford at which
Port she arrived on the 29th instant, and
having on the passage encountered several

heavy gales of wind and falling bar and
accompanying storms to wit his protest against the
winds and waves, heavy seas, gales of wind
and all other causes which the said ship
both sustained loss or damage in her hull
than, apparel or cargo, with liberty to extend
