

Public seals commissioned and sworn, residing in the City of New Bedford, County and Commonwealth of Massachusetts, went with the original promissory note (or true copy whereof is on the other side written) to the place of business of Allen D. Phillips and Eleazer Phillips the promissors therein named, and the days of payment having expired, the 30th falling on Sunday, demanded of Allen D. Phillips payment of the said note which he refused saying "the old man (meaning Eleazer Phillips) has gone to Boston to see to it."

Whereupon I the said Notary at the request aforesaid, did protest and by then presents do publicly and solemnly protest, as well against the promissors and indorsers of the said note as against all others whom it doth or may concern, for exchange, or exchange, and all costs, charges and interest already incurred and to be hereafter incurred, for want of payment of the said note. I have also notified the endorser by mail under cover to Lotan Currier & Co Merchants Boston, demanding payment of them respectively, bearing a like notice and demand with the said Allen D. Phillips for Eleazer Phillips.
