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Be it remembered that on this 20th day of
April 1850. before me William H. Taylor a
Notary Public duly commissioned and sworn residing
in the City of New Bedford County of Dukes
Commonwealth of Massachusetts, personally appeared J. P. Baker
master of the Barque Maria of Boston of the burden
of 824 tons or thereabouts, then lying in the harbor
of New Bedford aforesaid and that he
declared in said Barque on the 25 day of December

1849. laden with a cargo of Oil & Whalebone and
arrived at this Port on the 25 day of April instant,
having experienced heavy and tempestuous weather
on the passage whereby he fears that the said vessel
hath suffered damage in her hull or cargo, and
therefore desires to note his protest against the winds
waves, storms, tempests and all other causes
whereby the said vessel hath suffered damage
in her hull, tackle, apparel or cargo during her
said passage from Providence to New Bedford
with liberty to extend the same at pleasure

request of Messrs Hatch Frazer & J. Williams & Co.
I, J. P. Baker, Notary Public, duly commissioned and
sworn, residing in the City of New Bedford County
and Commonwealth aforesaid went with the original
note of hand or true copy, whereof is on the other
side written to Messrs Phillips one of the promisors
on said note and speaking with him, the days
of payment having expired, demanded of him
payment of said note which he refused, saying
"we do not pay it to day."

and solemnly protest, as well against the promisors
