Albert Williams, James Glass and Jack Mann
were all discharged at Maui in pursuance of
agreement made with them respectively at the
time of shipment, and that the reason no
certificate appears of such discharge is that at
the time of such discharge, the men were sent
on shore from the ship while she was lying off
and on some miles from the shore in charge of
the mate, the Captain being on shore sick and
unable to attend to business.
