On this 1st day of June in the Year
of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & fifty
at the request of Messrs Heath Gray & Co, of
William H. Fugler a Notary Public duly commissioned
and sworn, residing in the City of New Beaufort,
County and Commonwealth aforesaid, went
with the original note of hand (a true copy
whereof is on the other side written) to the Hon.
of Andrew P. Binnell, and speaking with
him, the days of payment having expired
demanded payment of the said note, which
he refused, saying "I cannot pay it to day".

Whereupon I the said Notary, at the request
aforesaid, did protest, and by then presents
do publicly and solemnly protest as well
against the promise and validity of the
said note, as against all others whom
it doth or may concern, for exchange, re-
-exchange, and all costs, damages and interest
already incurred, and to be hereafter incurred

Personally appeared P. H. Woodbridge
master of the Dague Fortune of New Beaufort
and on oath declared that Jeremiah H.
Brown, William H. Martin and Thomas
Helms were discharged from this ship
at the Bay of Islands, New Zealand at
their own request, and then being no Consul
agent of the United States at that Port
no certificate of such discharge could be
obtained in the form required by law. That
John Levine did not sail from this
Port in said ship. That Frederick Woodbridge
died while in the Japan Sea, that George
Piper died at Tahiti and that
Henry Bell, Joe Fortune, George Bay and
Harry were all discharged at Tahiti and
