

the afternoon of the said 12 day of June
the schooner was run into by the ship
Brighton, then in tow of the Steamer Maria
-chrisette, and by the collision carried away
a part of the tarboard quarter rail, with
three stanchions, plankhead and bedworks,
and broke two planks and started the
fastenings of two others. That immediately
thereafter he got his said schooner under
way and proceeded to New Bedford where
he arrived at about 7 o'clock the same
evening and anchored near to the sailing
at Fairhaven. And now apprehending
loss and damage, desires to note his
protest against the winds, waves, tides,
currents, ships, steamers, collisions and
all other causes whereby the said schooner
has sustained loss or injury in her hull,
stern, sails, tackle, apparel and cargo
at any time during her said passage
from Pittston to Fairhaven, with
liberty to extend the same at pleasure
