In April 1868. Top caulked & bottom coppered
ship in good order. In Dec 1871 Caulked all over
bottom sheathed & coppered ship put in good
order.

Built in Bath in 1845, 31st tons Capt & crew
2cc 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ + 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ an fair Rate A 1 $\frac{1}{2}$

In 1852 Cunkled Top & Bottom Bottom the the
 & Coppered new main mass & new main
 rigging. The ship appears to be well built
 of Oak & has a few timber deck plank
 on Bottom the Bolts & spikes in Bottom
 plank are Copper fastening on keel stem
 & stern post appears to be part Iron -

In July 1955 had his top Cambrian and not in joint order bottom Copper.

In July 1809, had some small repairs about the top
new windlass and main mast - caulked all over - bottom
shoaled & coppered - Bk put in fair order -
In June 1810

In Aug 1863 had some partial repairs about the top - top and decks caulked - wood ends forward caulked - bottom coppered - Back appears to be in fair order -

Bark Active of New Bedford Cook & Mowatt &
Built in Baltimore in 1834. 2 dwt 333 lbs Copper 200
Average Sails & Rig 1st Rate 42

Rebuilt in Baltimore in 1850 and a part in good order. In 1852 had a new lower deck can thea fall over Bottom shea thea & Coppered ship in good order. In the Spring of 1856 had her top and masts calked & Bottom Coppered, put in good order.

In Nov. 1860 had an entire new top
above the lower deck new upper deck & frame new
walls Bark put in good order, sheath and coppered

In Aug. 1965 top caulked and put in good 'ole
bottom copper. Back in good order in the morning.

See 1868 Tab caulked. Bottom caulked
Sheathed and felloe Mated. Fore filled
in and Oak Sheathing put on.

In Sept 1841 had 8 Standing knees between
decks ceiling refastened. Top caulking pieces
of sheathing cut out on both sides and woods
ends when caulking found good. Also mated
