

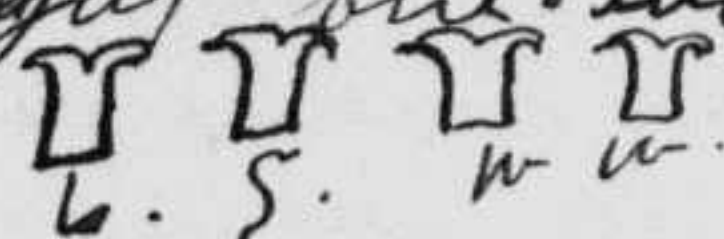
Remarks Thursday October the 31 1907

P.m. light southerly wind and clear weather. Close hauled all sails set. Watch on deck employed brack out reef and making Spinnaker. end of day Lat. 4.35 Longit. 25.00

Remarks Saturday November the 2nd 1907

P.m. light wind and squally weather. Close hauled all sails set. at 3 clock P.m. Mr. Jones saw a school of Whales from the deck. and we dropped down three boat mate struck on a second mate got two third mate got one. end of day. Sun obscure. 

Remarks Sunday November the 3rd 1907

P.m. light southerly wind and raining all day. and we cutting fore Whales and clear up the deck. end of day. Sun obscure

Remarks Monday November the fourth 1907

P.m. calm and squall with heavy rain all day employed trying out and brack out flume end of day Lat. Longit. 25.20

Remarks Tuesday the fifth 1907

P.m. light breeze and clear weather wind from Southward close hauled all sails set employed brack out water and beans. and stowed ~~down~~ down bouth 40 barrel of oil and clear up the deck washing off end of day. Lat. 3.40 Longit. 25.46

Remarks Wednesday November the 6th 1907

P.m. fresh southerly wind and clear weather. all sails set. Close hauled. Watch on deck employed fipsing flying off per net ~~and~~ and grey block spide handle. So. f. end of day Lat. 2.40 Longit. 26.58

Remarks Thursday November the 7th 1907

P.m. fine breeze and clear weather. Wind from South. Close hauled. all sails set. Watch on deck employed drying up cutting ~~parts~~ and rove labor the boat fore. and brack out bread. end of day Lat. 1.20 Longit. 28.13

Remarks Friday November the 8th 1907

P.m. light breeze and fine clear weather wind from SE. Close hauled all sails set Watch on deck employed plating. Serrate end of day Lat. 11 miles. Longit. 28.10

Remarks Saturday November the 9th 1907

P.m. steady breeze and fine clear weather wind from SE. all sails set close hauled Watch on deck employed brack out mollusca and ~~of~~ but plating serrate and painting trymark cover end of day

Lat. 1.40 Longit. 28.40
