P.m. steady breeze and cloudy weather
Wind from Southward. Close hauled all
sails set we saw one vessel bound South.
Lat 3.19 Longit. 29.17 end of day.

Remarks Monday November the 11th 1907

P.m. light SE. wind and clear weather. Close hauled
all sail set watch on deck employed
aboard. braces blocks and painting west
boat. ing side. and we saw one steamer
bound to SW. end of day
Lat 4.45 Longit 27 5-6

Remarks Tuesday November the 12th 1907

P.m. light breeze and clear weather
Wind from SE. all sails set at 6 clock
A.m. Mr. Jones saw a school of
whals off deck and we dropped down
the boat. mate struck second mate
one. third one. Lat 5.40 Longit 30.26
and we saw one vessel bound N.
end of day $\overline{U} \overline{U} \overline{U}$
L.W.S.

Remarks Wednesday November the 13th 1907

P.m. steady breeze and clear weather wind from
S. at 11 A.m. we finished cutting the three whals
and set all the sails and cleared up the
deck and start to try out end of day
Lat 5.30 S. Longit. 30 47

Remarks Thursday November the 14th 1907

P. fresh breeze and clear weather wind from
SE. close hauled all sail set. employed
finch try out and stowed down 38 barrel
of oil. end of day Lat 7.16 S. Longit 31.10

Remarks Friday November the 15th 1907

P.m. steady breeze and fine clear weather
Wind from SE. Close hauled all sails
set employed finch stowed down the oil
and cleared up the deck. and wash off.
end of the day. Lat 9.25 S. Longit 31.18

Remarks Saturday November the 16th 1907

P.m. light trade wind and fine clear weather
Course S.W. all sail set watch on deck
employed running off fore gallant sheet runner
and full up west boat to be with new line
and one of west boat fall new band wash
off the deck end of day Lat 11.30 S. Longit 31.18

Remarks Sunday November the 17th 1907

P.m. light SE. trade and fine clear
weather all sail set Course S.W. we
saw a bark bound to northward.
Lat 13.45 S. Longit 31.12

Remarks Monday November the 18th 1907

P.m. light easterly wind and fine clear weather
all sail set. Course S.W. watch on deck
employed Making a mast and other duty.
We saw one vessel bound to northward
end of day Lat 16.00 S. Longit 31.00

Remarks Tuesday November the 19th 1907

P.m. light easterly wind and fine clear
weather. Course S.W. with yard square
banded all the fore and aft sails watch
on deck employed banding new main
gallat sail and mattle crew the old
one. Saw one vessel bound S. and
broke out beef and molasra for stowd
end of day. Lat 17.34 S. Longit 31.14
