Remarks Wednesday December the 4th 1907

P.m. Strong NE. Wind and high sea.
~~say~~ the weather very hazy ship lay to
under lower topsail. Two whaling
schooner in sight. Watch employed
on ship duty end of day
Gat: 3353 Gon: 4758

Remarks Thursday December the 5th 1907

A.m. Strong breeze and rainy weather
at 9.30 more moderate set all the sails
at 7 P.m. shot her down to the lower
topsail let her lay. all must calm. Wind
from SE. Weather very hazy Watch on deck
employed on ship duty. end of day
Gat 3407 Gon: 4747

Remarks Friday December the 6th 1907

P.m. fresh steady breeze and cloudy weather
Wind from eastward all sails set at 7 P.m.
we shot her to the lower topsail let her lay.
Watch employed on ship duty. sun obscure
end of day

Remarks Saturday December the 7th 1907

P.m. light breeze and thick fog Wind from
NE. at 6 a.m. set topsails and gib foresail
at 7 P.m. shot her down to lower topsail
leave her to on port tack Watch on
deck employed bake out sugar beans peas
molasses and turning SB the boat fall new
end of day. no observations sun of-cure

Remarks Sunday December the 8th 1907

A.m. Strong SE. Wind and thick fog
at 11 clock clear up. and we set the topsails.
at 7 P.m. shot her down to lower topsails
leave her to on starboard the tack
and we saw a big school of gramps end of
day Gat 3443 Gon: 4848

Remarks Monday December the 9th 1907

P.m. light southerly wind and fine clear weather all
sails set Watch on deck employed repairing sails
and we spoke a ship. Captain Whant board of her
she from Baltimore October the 15- bound to Ann Arbor
