

Remarks Thursday December the 19th 1907

P.m. light southerly wind and fine clear weather all sail set. Sailing to the northward we saw two vessel bound W. Watch employed brake out water and fitting for gallant sail in of day. Gat 3616 Ton: 5057

Remarks Friday December the 20th 1907

P.m. Strong N.E. gale and rainy weather. Ship on short sails watch employed brake out flour and ship duty. Sun obscure no observations end of day

Remarks Saturday December the 21st 1907

P.m. Strong gale and high sea at two clock wind hauled to the S.W. and we running to the northward till 7 P.m. and heaver her to on starboard tack and tacking on fore lower topsails. Sun obscure no observations end of day.

Remarks Sunday December the 22 1907

P.m. Strong westerly wind and clear weather. We running to the northward under lower topsails all day. and we saw one bark and one schooner on short sails. end of day Gat 3444 Ton: 50.00

Remarks Monday December the 23 1907

P.m. light breeze and fine clear weather wind from N.W. we saw two ship bound S. and we been gaming with schooner John Manta watch employed brake out mollosa and beef end of day Gat: 3415 Ton: 49.35

Remarks Tuesday December the 24th 1907

P.m. Strong Northerly Wind and cloudy weather we has been running around on short sail. and we saw one bark bound to the eastward and schooner John Manta watch employed on ship duty end of day Gat 3425 Ton: 49.05

Remarks Wednesday December the 25th 1907

P.m. Strong breeze and clear weather at 3 clock Mr. Dorett saw a school of Whales and we lower down the boats. Mr. Gopps struck one Mr. Pary one and Mr. Dorett whale broke his mast and boom so the mate boom broke. So we striking on every thing but lower topsail end of day Gat: 3425 Ton: 49.21

Remarks Thursday December the 26th 1907

P.m. Strong N.W. Wind and clear weather and the crew merchants refuse duty and we got them to work. We cutting two Whales and line one head out side and blows very strong. we saw one schooner. end of day Gat 3410 Ton: 48.54

Remarks Friday December the 27th 1907

P.m. light breeze and clear weather wind from N.W. with heavy ground swell. we cutting one head and send down the gags and try out end of day Gat 3400 Ton: 49.02

Remarks Saturday December the 28th 1907

P.m. Strong N.E. Wind and clear weather employed trying out and stow down some oil. brake out water flour beans. and we saw one vessel bound to the S.W. and she was gaming wit bark Alice knows end of day Gat 3405 Ton: 49.09
