P.m. Strong gale wind and heavy weather
Wind from NE. Ship laying on main topsail
and we finish stow down the oil and
clear up the deck we stow down 68 barrel
of oil end of day. no observations sun obscure

Remarks Monday December the 30th 1907

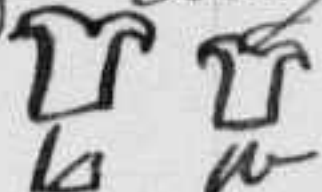
P.m. Strong breeze and clear weather. Wind
from SW. Ship on the topsails. at 7 P.m.
short her down to the lower topsails
let lay. on port tack watch employed
broke out bread and straight up fore
hole and other duty end of day

Remarks Tuesday December the 31 1907

P.m. Strong breeze and clear weather. Wind
from NE. watch employed setting up main
rigging and at 4 P.m. Mr. Dorset saw
a school of whals and we drop the boats
mate struck one second mate one bark
Alice knows, got whal to end of day

Lat 33.55- Lon: 49.18



Remarks Wednesday January the first 1908

P.m. Strong breeze and squally weather.
with heavy rain. we cutting the two whals
and clear up the heads. and start the work
Ship laying on main lower topsail. end of
day. no observations sun obscure

Remarks Thursday January the 2nd 1908

P.m. Strong SW. wind and clear weather
employed finish tryout and stow
down 26 barrel of oil bark Alice knows
in sight. end of day Lat. 33.55- Lon: 49.22

Remarks Friday January the 3rd 1908

P.m. Strong SW. wind and clear weather
Ship laying on lower topsail watch employed
broke out sugar and pease bark Alice knows
in sight end of day Lat 33.50 Lon: 49.04

Remarks Saturday January the 4th 1908

P.m. light breeze and clear weather Wind from
SE. all sail set watch employed on ship duty
we been gaming with bark. Alice knows
end of day Lat 33.30 Lon: 49.27

Remarks Sunday January the 5th 1908

P.m. light breeze and fine clear weather Wind
from SE. on morning was calm and Mr. Dorset
saw a school of whals so bark Alice knows.
and we drop down the boats and Alice boat
run over them we never got any. saw
one vessel bound North. end of day

Lat 33.25- Lon: 49.43

Remarks Monday January the 6th 1908

P.m. light breeze and fine clear weather Wind
from N. all sail set. on morning Gorupio
saw a school of whals to the windward
bark Alice knows was to windward
and we all drop down boats there was gone
to fast we came back aboard bark Alice
drop down again she struck. we saw
one vessel bound to westward watch employed
broke out flour beef mollaras end of day

Lat 33.14 Lon: 49.45

Remarks Tuesday January the 7th 1908

P.m. Strong breeze and squally weather
Ship under the short sails at 3 clock
Mr Dorset saw a sport and then came
thick with rain squall we never see it
again end of day sun obscure
