Wind from N. all sail out at 7 P.m.
we short down to lower topsail heave
her to on port tack watch employed
finck stowed down the oil 46 barrel;
wash her down. three vessel in sight
end of day Lat 34.14 Lon: 49.42

Remarks Sunday January the 12th 1908

P.m. steady breeze and fine clear weather
Wind from N. all sail set we saw 4 whaling
vessel and we gaming with bark Grayson
and schooner John Mowat end of day
Lat 34.10 Lon: 49.34

Remarks Monday January the 13th 1908

P.m. strong wind from NE. and very squally
with heavy rain ship lay on lower topsail
watch employed on ship duty end of day
Sun obscure. no observations

Remarks Tuesday January the 14th 1908

P.m. strong breeze and squally weather
with rain. Wind from W. ship laying on
lower topsail we saw one schooner and
one bark on short sails watch employed
on ship duty end of day Lat 34.20 Lon: 48.37

Remarks Wednesday January the 15th 1908

P.m. strong westerly wind and clear weather
Ship lay on lower topsail watch
employed brack out beef and mollarra
and other duty end of day
Lat 34.05 Lon: 48.37

Remarks Thursday January the 16th 1908

P.m. light breeze and fine clear weather
Wind from N. all sail set in morning
Mr. Pary saw a school of Whals and
we drop down the boats second mate
got first and he get stove third mate
got his whal and mate struck one
and killed and flayed ship pick up
and he went of and struck again
and he got stove lost the whal. came a
board. Cut ing one of the whal. Lat 34.07 Lon: 48.37
