two casks of water and fill it with
oil end of day no observations.

Remarks Sunday January the 19th 1908

P.m. strong southerly wind and clear
weather ship on short sail Watch
employed finish try out and brake out
water and stowed down some oil
end of day Lat: 34.34 Lon: 49.38

Remarks Monday January the 20th 1908

P.m. light breeze and clear weather.
heavy swell from South. ship on
short sail Watch employed finish stowed
down the oil 88 barrel. and clear up
the deck and wash off ~~the~~ sand brake
out bread flour and saw two vessel
bound South. end of day Lat 34.06 Lon: 49.19

Remarks Tuesday January the 21 1908

P.m. steady breeze and fine clear weather. Wind
from S at 6 A.m. Lawrence saw a school of
whales and we dropped down two boats and
mate take one new boat of the house
right up and lower down second mate got
one bird one mate one and cut them on
ing. end of day Lat 34.14 Lon: 48.58 U. W. S.

Remarks Wednesday January the 22 1908

P.m. strong breeze and clear weather
Wind from S with heavy swell ship on
short sail employed try out and brake
out sugar end of day. Lat 34.14 Lon: 48.57.

Remarks Thursday January the 23th 1908

P.m. light easterly wind and fine clear weather
all sail set. Watch employed. finish try out
sand stowed down some of oil at 7 clock
short her down on lower topsails end of day.
Lat: 34.03 Lon: 49.08

Remarks Friday January the 24th 1908

P.m. steady breeze and fine weather wind
from NE. at 7 clock short her down to
the lower top sail. hoist her to on
port tack Watch employed finish stowed
down the oil 56 barrel and wash of deck
brake out beans molasses end of day
Lat 34.11 Lon: 49.05

Remarks Saturday January the 25th 1908

P.m. light breeze and heavy weather wind
from NE. all sail set. at 7 p.m. short
her down to lower top sail. and we brake
out one coil of tow line. and other duty.
end of day Sun obscure no observations.

Remarks Sunday January the 26th 1908

P.m. squally weather. and heavy rain all
day. Wind from E. ship on short sails
Watch employed on ship duty
end of day Sun obscure
