and one coiled of tow line and other  
duty end of day Fat 10.25 Ton: 41.27

Remarks Friday March the 20th. 1908

P.m. steady breeze and cloudy weather  
all sails set. till 7 P.m. short her  
down to the low topsails and hauler  
to on starboard the tack. watch employed  
brack out sugar and other duty end of day  
Fat 12.5 Ton: 43.26

Remarks Saturday March the 21 1908

P.m. strong trade wind and cloudy  
weather. Ship has been running to  
the westward. all day. at 6 P.m.  
short her down to low topsails  
hauler to on starboard tack. watch  
employed row ~~hauler~~ well rope and  
other duty end of day. Fat 13.15 Ton: 45.07

Remarks Sunday March the 22 1908

P.m. strong trade wind and cloudy  
weather course W. at 6 clock short  
her down to low topsails and steel  
going to the westward. end of day  
Fat 13.13 Ton: 46.48

Remarks Monday March the 23th. 1908

P.m. strong trade wind and cloudy  
weather ship running to the W. with  
topsails and main gallant sail at ~~one~~  
clock Mr. Jones saw one whale and got  
ship back for one hour we never ~~shot~~  
see it again. employed brack out flour  
end of day Fat 13.00 Ton: 49.20

Remarks Tuesday March the 24th. 1908

P.m. strong trade wind and cloudy weather  
ship running under topsails and main gallant sail  
course west. & y. watch employed brack out water  
and other duty. end of day Fat 13.11 Ton: 52.14

Remarks Wednesday March the 25th 1908

P.m. strong trade wind and cloudy weather  
course W. & N. sails all but fore and aft.  
watch employed scraping masts and  
other duty end of day Fat 13.11 Ton: 55.13

Remarks Thursday March the 26th. 1908

P.m. steady trade wind and squally weather  
course W. & N. sails all but fore and aft  
watch employed washing the ship and  
we saw one steamer bound to the  
southward. end of day Fat 13.10 Ton: 57.57

Remarks Friday March the 27th 1908

at 2.55 A.m. we saw barbados light  
at 8.30 we take a pilot at 10 we anchor  
and capturing went shore sent a board  
meat potatoes sugar rice peas mullosa  
feather candles cabbage paint oil and  
spaniard and sawyer. end of day.

Remarks Saturday March the 28th. 1908

fine clear weather wind from the received a board  
ship on piece of pitch pine and 30 pound of beef  
and wags. and 3 pound of spifs. at 4.30 we  
get under way to dominica. and set all the  
sails course N.W. end of day

Remarks Sunday March the 29th. 1908 P.m. steady breeze and fine  
weather all sails set at 2 clock we anchor her on dominica  
end of day
