

Remarks on board the bark weather

Tuesday

April the 21 1908 throughout this day light breeze and fine weather wind from E. employed taking wood a board and stowed down, and shaver some men employed from the shore end of day

Wednesday

April the 22 1908 throughout this day light breeze and fine clear weather wind from E. employed finish taking wood and straining up and all ready for sea. one man and third mate desert. Came a board some meat. end of day

Thursday

April the 23rd 1908 throughout this day light breeze and fine clear weather at 10 a.m. we leave dominica to St Eustatia and we got 17 men from there at 6 o'clock Lorenzo saw a school of whales end of day.

Friday

April the 24 1908 throughout this day light breeze and cloudy weather wind from E. at 9 30 we anchor on St. Eustatia, employed fixing fore top back stay. end of day

Saturday

April the 25th 1908 throughout this day light breeze and fine clear weather wind from E employed painting ship and set up head ~~gangs~~ gear and came board piece of meat end of day.

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Sunday

April the 26th 1908 throughout this day light breeze and fine clear weather wind from E end of day.

Monday

April the 27th 1908. throughout this day light breeze and clear weather wind from E. employed painting boats and taking potatoes and yams end of day

Tuesday

April the 28th 1908 throughout this day fresh breeze and clear weather wind from SE finish taking a board the provision and a pig. end of day

Wednesday

April the 29th 1908 Throughout this day fresh breeze and clear weather wind from SE. at 2 P.m. we sail from St. Eustatia for whaling ground and we shipping boat head and one boat star. and 3 mate Mr. Doest and Christpha D. millo John Morre. Joseph S. William. Henry Senne. James Garrison. Joseph Prosser. Joseph Sylva. Edward E. Oulubridge. Emanuel Peter. Feliph D. Rosario Deserted ship on Dominica and William Landmark. and Albert Gerli Deserted at St Eustatia. and we shipping 14 men from Dominica end of day
