Friday

June the 5th. 1908 p.m. light breeze and hazy weather wind from N. watch employed finish stow down the oil 61 barrel and wash of the ship. saw two vessel and steamer end of day Lat 38°05' Lon: 70°45'

Saturday

June the 6th. 1908

p.m. strong breeze and hazy weather wind from NE ship lay on low topsails watch employed on ship duty. end of day Lat 39°35' Lon: 71°37'

Sunday

June the 7th 1908 p.m.

strong breeze and cloudy weather wind from NE ship lay to on low topsails at 2 clock weather more moderate Benson saw a school of whals and we drop down the boats mate struck one second mate 2 boathead one end of day no observation

June the 8th 1908

p.m. calm and clear weather employed cutting the whals and try out at 230 captain saw a school of whals and we drop down the boats mate struck one and iron came out and was to calm the boats came aboard end of day Lat 37°30' Lon: 69°06'

Tuesday

June the 9th. 1908

p.m. light breeze and cloudy weather wind from SE. all sails out at 7 clock taking in light sails watch employed dry out and other duty. end of day Lat 38°43' Lon: 69°49'

Wednesday

June the 10th. 1908 p.m. strong breeze and cloudy with heavy rain wind from NE all sails out at 7 p.m. short her down to the low topsails watch employed finish dry out and stow down 50 barrel and clear up the deck end of day. no observation

Thursday

June the 11th. 1908 p.m. strong breeze and cloudy weather wind from S all sails out close hauled watch employed on ship duty end of day Lat 38°05' Lon: 68°09'

Friday

June the 12th. 1908 p.m. light breeze and fine clear weather. wind from S all sails out course ESE employed brake out huf and other duty end of day Lat 37°40' Lon: 62°48'

Saturday

June the 13th 1908 p.m. light breeze and cloudy weather wind from SW. all sails out course ESE. employed making boats gib and other duty end of day. no observation sun obscure.

Sunday

June the 14th 1908 p.m. light breeze and cloudy weather wind from NW. at 5:30 a.m. Mr. Perry saw a school of whals and we drop down the boats mate struck one second mate one boathead one and Benson struck one got them a board of ship cut them and sent down the gags end of day Lat 37°22' Lon: 60°01'
