

## Remarks on the board the bark Bertha

Sunday

July the 5<sup>th</sup> 1908 p.m. light breeze and fine weather wind from SE all sails out at 7 clock hauled fore and main gallant sails. and standed to the eastward. Saw one vessel end of day Lat 32.50 Lon: 52.57

Monday

July the 6<sup>th</sup> 1908 p.m. light breeze and fine clear weather wind from SE all sails out close hauled watch employed broke out but flour beans and bread. and other duty. end of day Lat 33.05 Lon: 52.43

Tuesday

July the 7<sup>th</sup> 1908 p.m. light breeze and fine clear weather wind from S. all sails out. close hauled watch employed painting anchor and tannin. Manuel sick off duty end of day. Lat 33.30 Lon: 52.57

Wednesday

July the 8<sup>th</sup> 1908 p.m. light breeze and fine weather all sails out wind from S. at 2.15 p.m. Louis Silver saw a large whale and drop down the boat we never got it. Saw one brig. at 7. shot her down to low topsail watch employed fixing pump and painting topsails run. end of day Lat 33.38 Lon: 51.25

## Remarks on board of bark Bertha

Thursday

July the 9<sup>th</sup> 1908 p.m. steady breeze and cloudy weather at p.m. and heavy rain all sails out wind from S. at 6 a.m. Mr. Perry saw a large whale and we drop down the boats and been chasing all day never got it. and at 7 taking all the light sails. end of day. Lat 33.34 Lon: 51.35

Friday

July the 10<sup>th</sup> 1908 p.m. light breeze and fine clear weather wind from SW all sails out watch duty on ship duty. and been gaming with bark Alice Nowels end of day Lat 33.54 Lon: 51.07

Saturday

July the 11<sup>th</sup> 1908 p.m. light breeze and fine clear weather wind from SW all sails out watch employed on ship duty we saw 4 vessel and we gaming Brig Sullivan. at 7 clock starting on light sails and let her lay. end of day Lat 33.58 Lon: 51.23

Sunday

July the 12<sup>th</sup> 1908 p.m. light breeze and fine clear weather wind from S all sails out. at 5.30 a.m. Unisosa saw a large whale going to windward and we drop down the boats but never got it at 7 clock shot her down to the low topsails end of day Lat: 33.45 Lon: 51.18

Monday

July the 13<sup>th</sup> 1908 p.m. steady breeze and clear weather wind from SE all sails out at 5.30 Mr. Brown saw a large whale and we drop down the boats chasing it all day to windward. never got it. employed reving well rope end of day Lat 33.26 Lon: 51.15
