

Remarks on board the bark *Hertha*
Wednesday

August the 12th. 1908

p.m. steady breeze and cloudy weather wind from NW ship under topsail, course E by N. at 5:30 p.m. Frank Jones saw two whales and we drop down the boats Mr. Jones struck it. at

Sat 34.07 Lon: 46.34

Thursday

August the 13th. 1908

p.m. light breeze and fine weather wind from NW. employed cutting the whale and sawt down the gear and started to try out. and we spoke to schooner *Camro* bound to the E. all sails out. end of day

Sat 33.50 Lon: 46.35

Friday

August the 14th. 1908

p.m. light breeze and fine clear weather wind from N ship lay on short all sails try out and brack out flour beef and beans. saw one bark bound S. and one whaling bark cutting. and try out whale end of day. Sat 33.45 Lon: 46.32

Saturday

August the 15th. 1908

p.m. light breeze and fine clear weather wind from V. ship lay on short. sails employed finish try out and brack out water and stow down some oil down. the bark on sight. try out end of day

Sat 33.30 Lon: 46.30

Sunday

August the 16th. 1908

p.m. light breeze and cloudy weather wind from NW. all sails out courses N by E employed finish stow down the oil 64 barrel and clear up the deck. and gaining bark *Wonderer*. end of day Sat 33.25 Lon: 46.36

Remarks on the board of bark *Hertha*

Monday

August the 17th. 1908

p.m. light breeze and fine clear weather wind from NW all sails out courses N by N. watch employed on ship duty. bark *Wonderer* on sight end of day Sat 33.30 Lon: 47.06

Tuesday

August the 18th. 1908

p.m. light breeze and fine weather wind from NW. all sails out course E by S. at 7 clock taking on lights sails employed brack out bread and molasses. bark *Wonderer* on sight end of day Sat 34.50 Lon: 46.09

Wednesday

August the 19th. 1908

p.m. light breeze and cloudy weather wind from S. all sails out courses E by S. at 4.45 p.m. Benson saw a large whale and we drop the boats but not get it bark *Wonderer* lower her boats too and we saw a mother vessel to northward. employed on ship duty end of day Sat 34.13 Lon: 45.08

Thursday

August the 20th. 1908

p.m. light breeze and fine weather wind from S at 5.30 a.m. Mr. Jones saw a large whale and drop down the boats second mate struck it and came aboard cut him in end of day Sat 35.25 Lon: 44.42

Friday

August the 21st. 1908

p.m. light breeze and fine clear weather wind from S. all sails out close hauled watch employed try out end of day Sat 35.00 Lon: 43.51
