

Remarks on Monday June 23rd 1880

This morning comes in with fresh breezes and thick weather on each side. Sail fell in with plenty of ice, and at sunset came to anchor near Cape Charles with our best bower in ten fathoms water in company with Capt Low. —
so ends this day — 26 Days out Port ^{wind East}

Remarks on Tuesday June 24th 1880

This morning comes in with fresh breezes and thick foggy weather — got out one whale Boat sent her to try for fish — at 11 A.M. returned and caught nothing so ends this day with thick weather attended with snow. One day in Chumney tuble and 27 days out Port

Remarks on Wednesday June 25th 1880

This morning comes in with light winds & clear weather at 2 A.M. got under weigh in company with Capt Low with the wind at N.W., and at 2 P.M. returned the current setting to the westward we could not keep company with Capt Low, on account of our dull sailing, so ends the day 2 days in Chumney tuble and 28 days out Port

Remarks on Thursday June 26th 1880

This morning comes in with fresh breezes at 5 A.M. got under weigh from Chumney tuble — and at 8 A.M. about Cape Charles — bearing N.W. 4 miles Distance, at 11 A.M. Cape Lewis bore N.W. by W 3 leagues distance. at 11 P.M. came to anchor in spotted Island so ends the day 29 days out Port

Remarks on Friday June 27th 1880

This morning comes in with light winds and steady weather sent the yawl boat a gunning, and fishing at 4 P.M. returned with nothing. People employed in sundry jobs of ship duty kept over the topsail topgallant sail fore sail — and soft top so ends the day 30 days out Port and one in the spotted Islands

Remarks on Saturday June 28th 1880

This morning comes in with fresh breezes and foggy weather at 4 A.M. got under weigh in company with Capt Low — Middle part fresh breezes and thick weather made and took in sail accordingly and at 1 P.M. came to anchor in Long Island with our best bower made ship and sundry other jobs of ship duty
31 days out Port

Came on Steamer from Spotted Island to Long Island at 2 in fore sail with a little variation
