

14 Ship Herald of Fairhaven on a Whaling Voyage to

Monday 31st October
Commences with very heavy gales from the SW ship lying too hinder close mizen middle part inclined to moderate at 7 set the main top sail fore sail latter part more mod set the fore topsail

Tuesday 1st November
Begins with strong winds from the W at 4 pm commenced raining took in sail and hove to wind & took in the foresail middle part heavy gales and hail squalls at 6 called all hands took in the main top sail at 7 parted the main top sail ends with tremendous gales from

Wednesday 2nd
Commences with strong gales from the W and a very heavy sea hauled down the main top sail at 3 rather more moderate middle part rain at 7 a strong breeze from the W saw 2 right whales

Thursday 3rd
Commences with strong winds from the west set the fore topsail and mainsail at 2 furling them middle part moderate at 5 called all hands and made sail latter part gentle winds and a heavy swell saw few whales

Friday 4th
Commences with light winds and fine weather at dark took in sail for the night at 8 a squall with rain middle part strong gales and cloudy at 5 at 4 saw right whales once with strong

Saturday 5th
Commences with strong winds from the SW at 2 wore ship to the S at 4 inclined to moderate set the fore top sail and mainsail middle part strong winds took in sail and hove to latter part strong gales and cloudy

Sunday 6th November
Commences with strong winds from the W and cloudy weather at 5 rainy and moderate with a heavy swell middle part wind and weather much the same at 8 moderate set the fore topsail and mainsail wind SW ends with fine weather

Monday 7th
Commences with strong winds from the SW at 10 wore ship to the SW at 6 close reefed the topsails at 9 called all hands and made sail latter part strong winds from the SW at 11 took in the fore

Tuesday 8th
Commences with strong winds from the South steering the middle part light winds and good weather at 4 called all hands and made sail latter part calm at 11 at 10 a breeze from the W

Wednesday 9th
Begins with light winds from the W and fine weather at dark took in sail for the night middle part fresh winds and cloudy at 4 called all hands and made sail at 9 wore ship squally double reefed the topsails course SW

Thursday 10th
Commences with fresh winds and cloudy weather saw few whales at dark took in sail for the night middle part light winds and good weather at 4 called all hands and made sail latter part light winds and fine weather

Friday 11th
Commences with strong winds from the South at 2 furling ship to the SW saw few whales took in the main top gallant sail middle part strong gales from the SW wore ship at 2 at 7 wore ship to the SW ends with strong gales
