

14 Ship Herald of Fairhaven on a Whaling Voyage to

Monday 31<sup>st</sup> October  
 Commences with very heavy Gales from the S.W. ship being too hinder close mizen middle part inclined to moderate at 7 set the main top sail fore sail latter part more moderate set the fore topsail

Tuesday 1<sup>st</sup> November  
 Begins with strong winds from the W at 4 PM commenced raining took in sail and here too wind was well took in the foresail middle part heavy gales and hail squalls at 8 called all hands took in the waist boat at 9 furled the main topsail. Ends with tremendous gales from

Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup>  
 Commences with strong gales from the W and a very heavy sea hauled down the main topsail at 1 rather more moderate middle part calm at 7 a strong breeze from the W saw 2 right whales

Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup>  
 Commences with strong winds from the west set the fore topsail and mainsail at 2 furled them middle part moderate at 5 called all hands and made sail latter part gentle winds and a heavy swell in fore bags

Friday 4<sup>th</sup>  
 Commences with light winds and fine weather at dark took in sail for the night at 8 a squall with rain middle part strong gales and cloudy at 8 AM saw right whales once with strong

Saturday 5<sup>th</sup>  
 Commences with strong winds from the S.W. at 2 wore ship to the S.E. at 4 inclined to moderate got the fore top sail and mainsail middle part strong winds took in sail and here to latter part strong gales and cloudy

Sunday 6<sup>th</sup> November  
 Commences with strong winds from the W and cloudy weather at 5 raining and moderate with a heavy swell middle part wind and weather much the same at 8 moderate set the fore topsail and mainsail wind S.W. ends with fine weather

Monday 7<sup>th</sup>  
 Commences with strong winds from the S.W. at 10 PM wore ship to the S.W. at 6 close reefed the topsails at 9 called all hands and made sail latter part strong winds from the S.W. at 11 took in the fore

Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup>  
 Commences with strong winds from the South steering S.W. middle part light winds and good weather at 4 called all hands and made sail latter part calm at 11 took a breeze from the S.W.

Wednesday 9<sup>th</sup>  
 Begins with light winds from the S.W. and fine weather at dark took in sail for the night middle part fresh winds and cloudy at 4 called all hands and made sail at 9 wore ship squalls double reefed the topsails course 160°

Thursday 10<sup>th</sup>  
 Commences with fresh winds and cloudy weather saw fin back at dark took in sail for the night middle part light winds and good weather at 4 called all hands and made sail latter part light winds and fine weather

Friday 11<sup>th</sup>  
 Commences with strong winds from the South at 2 furled ship to the S.W. saw fin back took in the main top gallant sail middle part strong gales from the S.W. wore ship at 7 wore ship to the S.W. ends with strong gales
