248 Sunday 16th 60
 Begins with brisk breezes and fine
 weather at 10M huffed up. Wind traced
 the yards at dark doubt the reefed the topsail
 outside part moderate made sail
 lower part light winds and fine
 weather Lat 41.15 Long 121.49 W

249 Monday 17th
First, four, light winds from the
NE and S.E. sent at 6 double reefed
the topsails middle part, light airs and
calms made spoil latter four falcants
upheld the fore topsails to repair and
sent another Lat 41°30 Long 68°55

Begins with light winds and fine
weather employed in mending sails
numbers of birds around of various kinds
at dark took in sail middle part mod
sawery part fresh winds and fine
weather at 10 saw a whale going quick
to the S Lat 42° 20' S Long 82° 45' W

Wednesday 19th
Commenced with thick fogges and
foggy weather at 6 AM in soil
middle part fresh winds at 10 AM
soil saw the land bearing W 10 miles
dist. latter part fresh gulf wind at 10
south reefed the topsails
