

Monday May 1st

263 Begins with fresh winds from land squally at 2 P.M. saw two right whales going quick to the S. several could not get up with them took in sail mid part moderate at 6 made sail at 7 saw whales toward the going quick latter part fresh winds and fair weather Lat 42° 13' S

Tuesday 2nd

264 Commences with fresh winds from W. saw several whales going quick chased them saw a ship off the lee at dark took in sail for the night mid part squally at 7 set the fore topsail at 9 took it in latter part strong winds from S in ship in sight Lat 42° 45'

Wednesday 3rd

265 Begins with strong winds and cloudy weather ship heading W mid part moderate at 6 made sail strong ship in sight latter part light winds from NE Lat 42° 40'

Thursday 4th

266 Commences with light winds from NE at 2 P.M. spoke ship Makana of Lyons at 4 rain took in sail and hove to mid part moderate at 8 took set the topsails double reefed Lat 42° 50' S

Friday 5th

267 Begins with light winds and thick weather at 1 P.M. saw four ships at dark took in sail mid part strong winds from S reefed the fore shil latter part more moderate set the topsails Lat 41° 27' Long 57° 55' W

Saturday 6th May

268 Commences with light wind from land fine weather set the jib and mainsail saw a fine back appearance middle part light winds from NE at 6 set all sail steering S by E latter part fresh winds and heavy weather took in main top gallingsail Lat 42° 18' S

Sunday 7th May

269 Begins with strong winds from the N at 2 P.M. took in sail and hove to ship heading W mid part moderate and thick latter part calm Lat 42° 05' S

Monday 8th

270 Commences with light air from S.W. made sail at 3 P.M. thick fog middle part strong winds and thick furled the fore sail latter part fresh winds and thick at fathoms

Tuesday 9th

271 Begins with strong winds from W by N and thick rising weather at 4 sound 58 fathoms mid part light winds and clear latter part fresh winds and clear ship in sight Lat 42° 24' S

Wednesday 10th

272 Commences with light wind from S.W. and fine weather at 2 P.M. saw two whales going quick chased them at 4 took in sail mid part moderate at 6 made sail and chased whales could not get fast at 8 took in lower sail again struck kill a right whale Lat 41° 40' S
