

303 Saturday 10th June
Commenced with light
winds and fine weather at
4 P.M. finished stowing down
as I passed a dead sperm
whale middle part, wind
very light, latter part, no altera-
tion Lat 33° 33' Long 46° 36'

304 Sunday 11th
Begins with light winds and
fine weather all sail set course
at 10 A.M. middle strong breeze from
the S. as I put the main top
sail and double reefed the fore
and main latter part strong
gales and heavy sea Lat 31° 14' Long 46° 11'

305 Monday 12th
Strong gales and squally wea-
ther fore reefed the topsails
middle part moderate made
sail latter part light winds
and pleasant weather two sail
in sight, being the sprinker

306 Tuesday 13th
Commenced with light airs
and variable at 8 P.M. middle
part light winds from the NE
latter part squally with rain
reefed the topsails
Lat 28° 50' Long 46° 26'

307 Wednesday 14th
Begins with squally rainy wea-
ther wind shifted close reefed the
fore and main topsails and
put the main middle part
from moderate made sail
latter part light winds and
fine weather sent up the main
topgallant mast
Lat 24° 50' Long 43° 52'

308 Thursday 15th June
Commenced with light winds
and fine weather sent up the
fore topgallant, main and yard
as I took a turner to the main
for distance of the main from
the star strakes only 44° 05' W
middle part, very pleasant
latter part, light winds and
pleasant weather
Lat 26° 30' Long 44° 09'

309 Friday 16th
Begins with light winds from
the S. the fore topgallant sail
all hands employed in securing
ship and then fold middle part
wind light, latter part, in
delayed in securing ship
Lat 25° 15' Long 43° 32'

310 Saturday 17th June
Commenced with light winds and
pleasant weather ship heading
N wind ESE middle part, fresh
winds at 6 P.M. saw the land bearing
N.W. 30 miles distant, at 11 the Island of
St. Sebastian bore W 20 miles

311 Sunday 18th
Commenced with fresh winds from
from the ENE at 2 P.M. tacked ship
and stood off at 8 tacked on at 5 tacked
off at 11 saw a brig and schooner steering
N. as I reefed the topsails and fore
led the topgallant sails middle part
wind fresh latter part, more
moderate Lat 24° 30' Long 43° 49'

312 Monday 19th
Begins with gentle winds
and pleasant weather at
3 P.M. tacked ship to the SE
at 10 tacked to the SE middle part
strong winds and flying clouds reefed
the topsails latter part much
the same
Lat 24° 50' Long 43° 02'
