Monday 28<sup>th</sup> August  
388 Commences with moderate winds and a heavy swell from the S.W. middle part wind from the N increased to a gale latter part heavy gales and cloudy weather 11000

Tuesday 29<sup>th</sup>  
389 Begins with fresh gales from N.W. clouds weather mid part with much the same as 8 A.M. more moderate hauled to N.W. 11000

Wednesday 30<sup>th</sup>  
390 Commences with fresh winds from N.W. quite moderate set the main topsail mid part wind hauled to N.W. at 6 set the fore sail ends with fresh gales Lat 38° 25' Long 21° 36' W.

Thursday 31<sup>st</sup>  
391 Begins with fresh gales from N.W. raised the fore sail at 9 P.M. squally took in the fore sail and main topsail mid and latter part heavy gales Lat 38° 55' Long 21° 36' W.

Friday 1<sup>st</sup> September  
392 Begins with heavy gales from the N.W. and hail squally ship heading North at 1 P.M. split the fore top mast, stay sail middle part, squally at 7 more moderate weather, the stay sail to repair Lat 37° 30' Long 20° 45' W.

Saturday 2<sup>nd</sup> September  
393 Commences with strong gales and heavy sea from N.W. middle and latter parts much the same Lat 36° 37' Long 20° 45' W.

Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup> September  
394 Begins with fresh winds and a heavy swell from N.W. at 3 P.M. set the main topsail and fore sail at 5 P.M. wind light middle part wind from N.W. and rainy latter part fresh gales Lat 36° 37' Long 20° 45' W.

Monday 4<sup>th</sup>  
395 Strong gales from N.W. at 6 o'clock with heavy mid part took in the main topsail and with heavy gales Lat 36° 40' Long 20° 45' W.

Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup>  
396 Begins with heavy gales and cloudy mid part more moderate set the main topsail and fore sail latter part fresh winds and thick Lat 36° 40' Long 20° 45' W.

Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup>  
397 Commences with fresh winds and cloudy weather at 1 P.M. saw a barque showing fore wind light at 3 P.M. the barque the Hope, gunnelt of New Bedford four months out, no oil, quick fresh, raising at 8 P.M. and by board the Hope ends with thick mazes and rain Lat 36° 40' Long 20° 45' W.

Thursday 7<sup>th</sup>  
398 Begins with fresh winds from N.W. at 2 P.M. started to N.W. took in the fore sail at 6 o'clock used to a gale mid part more moderate latter part light winds and thick and rainy 11000

Friday 8<sup>th</sup>  
399 Commences with light winds from N.W. at 5 P.M. the fore topsail at dark took in sail and have too heading E.S. mid part moderate and cloudy at 6 made sail latter part squally raised the topsails make
