clear weather at 6 P.M. in
mid part fresh gales and
rain from the N. at 8 P.M. in
the waist boat jured the main
top sail ends with very heavy
gales 100 lbs

407 Friday 22nd
Commences with heavy gales
from N. and rain weather at
4 P.M. clear middle and
latter part very heavy gales
from N. ship heading N. Lat 35.10 Long 16.2 W

408 Saturday 23rd
Heavy gales from N. ship
heading N. mid part wind light
at 6 P.M. made sail latter part
winds from E. saw a fin back
Lat 35.50 Long 16.02 W

409 Sunday 24th September
Begins with light winds and fine
weather saw fin back at dark took
in sail for the night ship steering
N. at 1 P.M. mid part calm at 5 P.M.
light air made sail latter
part light winds and pleasant
took a furrow the long 17.44 W
Lat 35.11 Long 17.04 W

410 Monday 25th
Commences with light winds
from N. and fine weather at
2 P.M. saw a whale at 5 P.M. lowered
could not get fast came on board
took in sail mid and latter part
fresh gales from N. Lat 35.00

411 Tuesday 26th
Begins with fresh gales from N. at
1 P.M. set the fore sail ship
heading N. mid part moderate
at 3 P.M. sail a ship in sight
latter part fresh winds and fine
weather lowered for a whale
going quick could not get up in
the water Lat 35.02

412 Wednesday 27th
Begins with on the water from
the N. at 1 P.M. spoke ship ship
latter Andrew of New London
3 months out 1150 lbs of sperm
mid part strong was at
latter part squally Lat 35.12 Long 16.33

413 Thursday 28th
Commences with strong gales
from N. mid part squally
at 3 P.M. made sail a ship in sight
latter part calm unbent
the main sail to repair
Lat 35.00 Long 16.34
