Commenced with fresh
winds and squally weather
at 3 P.M. spoke ship Leonidas
Stewart of Fairhaven two
sperm whales took in sail
mid and later fresh strong
winds from the S.W. Lat 34° 13' Long 22° 13' 30"

Wednesday 15th
Commenced with fresh
winds from W at 2 P.M.
chased a whale at dark close
under the topsails mid and fore
fresh winds and squalls
later fresh more moderate
turned the reef out Lat 33° 58' Long 22° 45'

Thursday 16th
Begins with light, soft and
pleasant weather at 3 o'clock
to the S.E. at 7 o'clock the topsails
heading S.W. middle part light
winds and pleasant saw
fin backs Lat 33° 50' Long 23° 03'

Friday 17th
Commenced with light winds
from S.W. and pleasant
weather at 3 P.M. saw two
right whales chased them
could not get fast
mid part light winds as
S.W. made sail at 1 o'clock
a right whale and feared
the line ends with fine
weather saw a ship show
ed Branch flag

Lat 33° 15' Long 23° 15'

Saturday 18th
Commenced with light
winds and fine weather
at 4 P.M. chased whales
at 7 took in sail mid and
later fresh light winds
and pleasant saw whale
to windward thus sail in
sight on boiling day 33° 52' Long 23° 55'

Sunday 19th
Begins with light winds
and pleasant saw fin backs
at dark double reefed the tops
with middle part wind ship
up to 10 at 4 made sail
later fresh light winds saw
fin backs showed sail in
sight Lat 34° 45' Long 24° 35'

Monday 20th
Commenced with fresh
winds from S.W. and fair
weather chased two whales
at 1 o'clock in sight at dark took
in sail heading S.W. mid
part moderate and later
made sail saw in sight
going quick chased him
to 10 P.M.

Tuesday 21st
Begins with fresh winds and
cloudy at 1 P.M. spoke ship
Bertha of New Bedford 500 tons
at 3 P.M. saw fin back at dark took
in sail with part light
winds and cloudy middle sail
later fresh with saw three
sail saw fin backs
to 10 P.M.
