Hudson, full, also the ship
and barque Long, Herman
Hedford 6000 Lat 36° 50'

Monday 19th
Commences with fresh
winds from the same dir
at 10 P.M. and chased
a whale, middle and
latter part, strong wind
and rough weather, ship
Hudson 4500 Lat 36° 50' Long 21° 50'

Tuesday 20th
Commences with fresh
winds and rough sea at
10 P.M. the Edward
middle part, more
moderate made sail
latter part, strong gales
from S. took in sail
Lat 36° 50' Long 21° 50'

Wednesday 21st
Begins with strong gales
from S. took in the
waist, bow, wind shift
ed to S.W. mid and
latter part, heavy gales
and rough. Lat 36° 50'

Thursday 22nd
Commences with heavy
gales from S.W. ship
Dagg saw two right whales
mid and latter part
calm and light air
saw two whales chased
them the sail in sight
