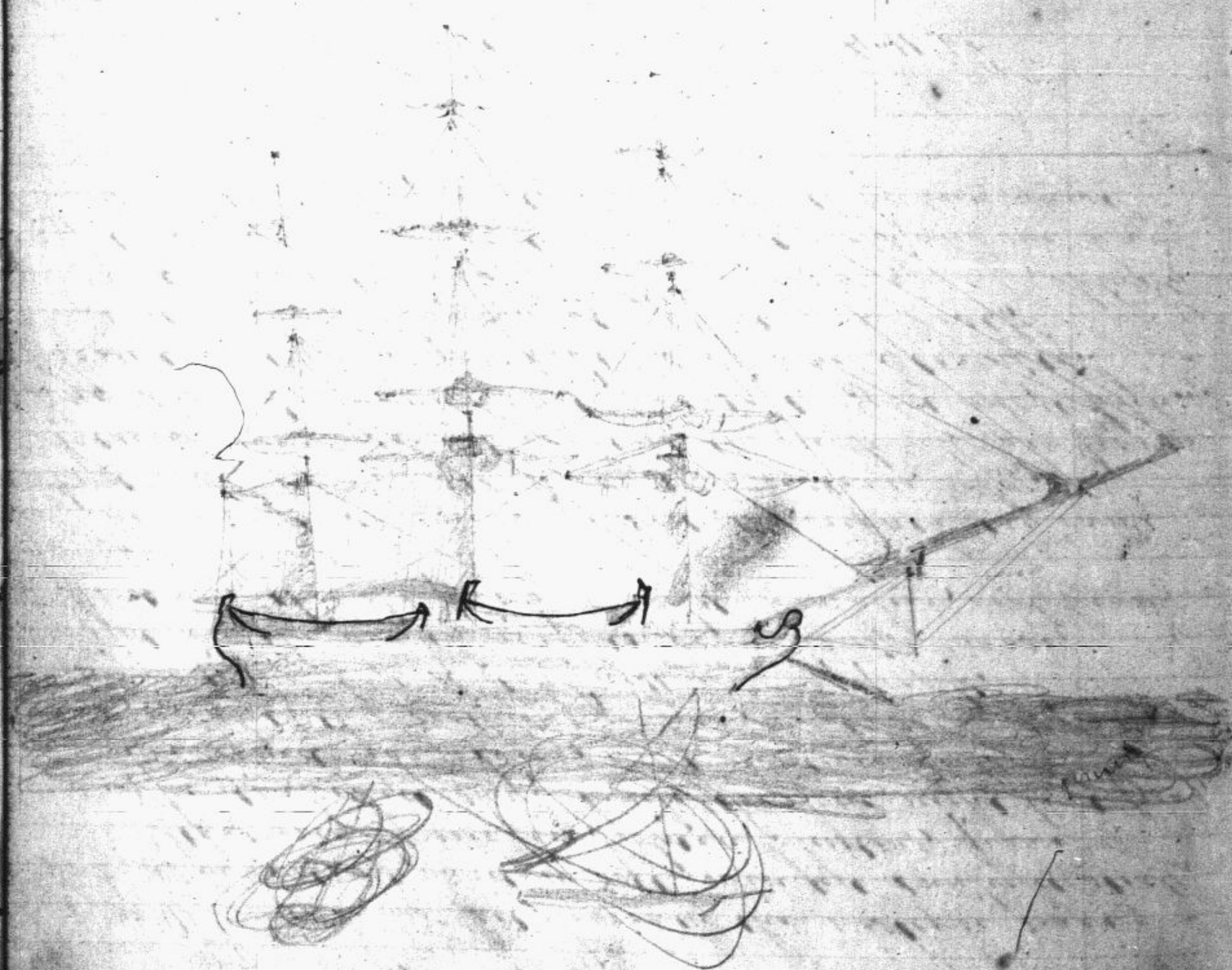


Journal of a Voyage
Ship in the Herald
Fairhaven
Zenas Dillingham
Master
commenced July 30th 1835
ended April 13th 1836



July 30th 1835 Thursday
Commenced with light winds
from the land raising the ship Herald
lying in the stream ready for sea
at 8 AM light breezes from the West
the pilot came on board got under
weigh and proceeded to sea

Friday 31st
Commenced with light winds
from the S.W. and others at 3 PM
let go the starboard anchor, the Island
of Puna bearing W 1/4 miles dist
at 2 AM got under weigh at 10 the
pilot left the ship at 5 PM sight of
the land of latter part strong winds
Long 100 miles from the S.W.

Saturday August 1st
Began with fresh winds from the
W at 3 PM Normans Land bore E 6 miles
dist course S.E. by S at 5 took in the fore
and main topgallant sails middle
strong winds and thick latter part
pleasant Lat 39° 57' Long 68° 13'

Sunday 2nd
First part moderate winds from
the S.W. saw two ships steering E
at 3 wind hauled to the westward run
bent the cables at 10 fresh winds from
the N.W. set fore topmast studding sail
latter part pleasant a heavy swell

Monday 3rd
Commenced with winds from the
N.W. course East caught a porpoise
saw a Barque steering W at mid day
first part latter part pleasant
the watch employed in ships duty

Tuesday 4th
Began with light winds from
the N.W. and fine weather mid
part wind hauled to the W shifted
studding sail latter part fresh winds
the watch employed in fitting
rigging Lat 39° 30' Long 61° 38'
