

Wednesday 5th August

7 Begins with strong winds from the Westward at 4 PM fresh squally with rain took in stud sails and topgallant sail middle part wind light made sail saw a Brig steering East saw a shoal of blackfish pulled too but did not see them again Lat 40°00' Long 58°08'

Thursday 6th

8 Commences with strong winds from the S.W. saw a ship ahead middle part made later part fresh winds and squally employed in flogging and cutting gear Lat 40°20' Long 56°08'

Friday 7th

9 First part fresh winds from the Westward at 5 PM squalls from the N.E. took in stud sails at 6 strong winds and squally saw blackfish towed the boat could not get past picked up a stick of timber Lat 40°01' Long 54°04'

Saturday 8th

10 Moderate winds fresh from the N.E. and pleasant weather at dark took in the steering sails and maced the yards middle part light air from the S.E. and calm backed ship to the N.E. later part strong winds and squally saw a fin back Lat 39°54'

Sunday 9th

11 Commences with fresh winds from the S.E. and thick weather at 6 took in the fore and main topgallant sails at 8 reefed the topsails thick and rainy later part made sail saw grasshoppers Lat 40°04' Long 50°46'

Monday 10th

12 Begins with light winds from the N.W. and pleasant weather steering S.E. saw a sail off the starboard bow mid part wind fresh winds saw grasshoppers later part pleasant Lat 40°47' Long 47°53'

Tuesday 11th August

13 First part light winds from the N.W. and fine weather steering S.E. saw a school of killers at dark took in stud sails squally part strong winds and squally later part moderate made sail saw a Barque steering N.W. Lat 40°48' Long 43°50'

Wednesday 12th

14 Commences with strong winds from the S.W. saw a sail steering East middle part wind light later part wind and weather much the same Lat 40°49' Long 41°58'

Thursday 13th

15 Begins with light winds from the S.W. and pleasant course S.E. by E saw a Brig middle part calm and rainy other wind N.E. and rainy saw a shoal of black fish lowered the boats but lost sight of them Lat 40°59' Long 40°04'

Friday 14th

16 Moderate winds from the N.E. and thick course S.E. saw a Brig steering eastward at 8 wind hauled to the S middle and later part calm spoke ship Henry Storer of Hudson 15 days out Lat 40°10' Long 39°25'

Saturday 15th

17 First part light winds and variable but a new main topgallant sail three sail in sight at 5 PM went on board the Henry Storer mid part moderate later part light winds and squally Lat 40°01' Long 37°49'

18 Commences with light winds from the S.W. and squally took in topgallant sails mid part rain and squally later part made set the topgallant sails saw a ship off the lee quarter Lat 39°34' Long 35°49'
