

Friday 25th December

- 149 Commenced with strong gales from the NW and rough sea starting down at 6 set the foresail saw whales near night, did not lower mid and latter part heavy gales Lat 35°17' Long 5°18' E

Saturday 26th

- 150 Begins with heavy gales from the NW employed in stowing down mid part, more moderate at 11 set the topsails finished hoisting saw whales a heavy sea with rain and strong gales Lat 35°38' Long 5°24' E

Sunday 27th

- 151 First part strong gales from NW at 1 PM saw 2 whales at dark ship under close reefed topsails heading SW mid part squally at 4 shaded whales latter part more moderate Lat 35°00' Long 5°31' E

Monday 28th

- 152 Begins with fresh winds from the NW saw whales took one to the ship and took in sail at 4 commenced cutting at 5 finished and began to boil Lat 34°48' Long 5°31' E

Tuesday 29th

- 153 Commences with fresh winds from NW double reefed top sails heading SW middle and latter part strong gales Lat 34°54' Long 5°28' E

Wednesday 30th

- 154 Begins with heavy gales from NW parted the fore sail mid part squally very heavy sea could not boil latter part inclined to moderate began boiling Lat 34°58' Long 5°13' E

Thursday 31st

- 155 First part, mod. winds from the NW a heavy swell latter part fresh winds and thick weather employed in stowing down

Lat 34°33' Long 5°13'

Friday 1st January 1836

- 156 Commenced with fresh winds from NW employed in stowing down at 1 PM double reefed top sails middle part squally took in sail at 4 made sail at heavy squalls from 1 wore ship to the NW and took in sail made with heavy gales Lat 35°16' Long 4°03' E

Saturday 2nd

- 157 Begins with strong gales from the NE and squally heading SW mid part more moderate at 11 made sail employed in cleaning bone saw a ship steering it

Lat 36°02' Long 3°58' E

Sunday 3rd

- 158 Commenced with moderate winds from the NE and pleasant took to the NE at dark double reefed the topsails heading E latter part thick and rainy

Lat 36°35' Long 5°12'

Monday 4th

- 159 Commenced with mod breeze from NE and thick heading east mid part fresh winds double reefed the topsails at 3 took in the topsails at 4 more mod made sail latter part strong gales employed squally in cleaning bone took in sail and hove too

Lat 36°17' Long 5°13'

Tuesday 5th

- 160 First part heavy gales from the NW ambient the fore sail to repair mid part wind light at 11 made sail steering SW latter part pleasant bent the fore topsail Lat 35°12' Long 5°26'

Wednesday 6th

- 161 Begins with light winds from NW and fine weather heading E up bent the main topsail at dark shortened sail middle and latter part light winds and pleasant all sail set

Lat 35°13' Long 5°17' E
