



May 22 1890
11 Ship Edward Querns East River
at 9 o'clock here started & took a
steamer and steered down the River under all sail
at midnight discharged the pilot of the mouth
off the river.

Monday 23 2 days
with light winds from E.S.E. steering
by the wind & under all sail at 5 P.M.
Black Island the last point here. The distance
about 5 leagues off from thence I take
my departure by the wind & Middle part
foggy. Tacked again at 2 P.M. tacked
ship to E.S.E. from nothing as ends as clear
D.R. 40-20 N Lat 40-40 W

Tuesday 24 3 days
born with light winds & foggy & under all
sail by the wind E.S.E. Head at a middle part
though the same latter part with some weather
foggy & the wind layed in hitting the wind
as ends Lat by D.R. 39-20 N Lat 40-40 W

Wednesday 25
born with light winds & thick fog steering
by the wind. At noon all sail was at E
at 4 P.M. the captain had him self had
the vessel up to put back for home. at
6 P.M. tacked ship and steered W.N.W. middle
and latter part rather foggy and rainy & we were
No. 66 Lat by D.R. 40-10 Lat 41-15

Thursday 26
commenced foggy and rainy & the weather
D.R. 40-10 at 6 P.M. tacked the vessel
again with 1/2 no middle part tacked to E.S.E.
at 4 P.M. Black Island bearing N.E. 1/2 N
1/2 leagues off & in bearing the ship
commenced to sail at Lat 40-10 D.R.
