September the 23

born with strong breeze from N.E. & steering N by E under all sail Middle Part ditto latter Part much the same saw nothing so ends in the latd 50-22 S Lgd 81-04 W

Saturday the 24

born with strong gale from N.E. & steering N by E under all sail Middle Part ditto the topsails and at 4 P.M. made all sail Middle Part fore ship to N.E. and at 8 P.M. were ships to off N.W. latter Part ditto saw finbacks employed in fetching the boat so ends in the latd 49-32 S Lgd 80-00 W

Sunday the 25

born with light winds from N.E. steering by the wind N by E at 4 P.M. backed ship to N.W. under all sail Middle Part ditto latter Part calm saw finbacks at 8 P.M. took a light wind from N.W. & steered N by E under all sail so ends in the fog saw nothing Latd 48-20 S Lgd 81-17 W

Monday the 26

born with light winds from N.E. & steering by the wind under all sail Middle Part & latter ditto saw nothing so ends calm & foggy in the Latd of 48-00 S Lgd 79-54 W

Tuesday the 27

born with foggy weather & light winds from N.E. & steering by the wind N under all sail Middle Part wind at N.W. & steering N by E latter Part ditto saw nothing so ends equally & c in the Latd 46-54 S Lgd 80-04 W

On the Coast of Chili

September the 28

born with strong breeze from N.W. & steering N by E under all sail at 4 P.M. the water green chile Part strong gale latter Part ditto saw nothing so ends under all sail wind at N.W. Latd 45-55 S Lgd 77-30 W

Thursday the 29

born with strong gale from S.W. & steering N by E under all drawing sail Middle Part ditto latter Part more moderate saw a ship & spoke her & it was the William Tell of Harve 10 months old 600 bbls saw a mother so ends in the Latd 42-05 S Lgd 76-00 W

Friday the 30

born with moderate gale & squally N.W. & steering by the wind under all sail spoke the Holland of Harve 20 m 700 bbls at dark shotened sail & at 8 P.M. were ship to N.W. under all sail Middle Part ditto latter Part saw right whale lowered and chased but all in vain & saw 6 ships so ends in the Latd 42-07 S Lgd 76-20 W

October the 1st

born with light winds from S.E. & steering N by E under all sail saw finbacks at dark took in sail double Reel the topsails Middle Part fine latter Part foggy saw a ship cutting in a whal & spoke her the Duke of Orleans of Harve 15 months 200 bbls of oil latd 42-07 S Lgd 77-15 W
