Colder the 10  
 born with light winds from N & steering  
 by the wind & 40 under all sail at 4 PM  
 upon the Encirleur of Hill Bedford station  
 Dec 10 at each shortens sail Middle Part  
 down gales took in the fore & mizen topsails  
 latter Part the same Wind at 4 heading N 8 W  
 so ends in the late 43-11-44 77-24 W

Tuesday the 11 115 days  
 born with strong gales from W & steering  
 by the wind S 8 W at 5 PM spoke the  
 ship George ill Warre 2100-28 months  
 and at 7 PM was ship to S 8 W under  
 East Ruff main topsail & foresail M Part  
 at 8 PM saw the right whale & lowered  
 the Chast but all in vain so ends in the  
 late 43-00-44 77-00

Wednesday the 12  
 born with fine weather employed in Chasing  
 Whales we Chast till dark could not catch  
 one came on board & shortened sail heading  
 S 8 W Wind at Middle Part calm latter Part  
 at 10 employed in mending sails so ends  
 in the late 43-145

Thursday the 13  
 born with light winds from S 8 W at  
 meridian saw eight whales & at 2 PM  
 lowered & the Larkward caught one and at 3 PM  
 took him to the ship and commenced cutting  
 & at dark lashed down the tuckles & at daylight  
 commenced cutting again and at 10 PM finished  
 saw one Whale the Island of George in sight  
 about 40 miles off at meridian lowered after  
 Whales so ends in the late 43-2 44 75-45 W

# Star Whale

## October the 14

born with moderate gales from N 8 W  
 employed in chasing whales & the Starboard  
 boat struck a sperm whale and got him  
 and took him to the ship & by his hammer  
 off shore middle Part rainy latter Part moderate  
 at daylight commenced cutting the  
 along in sight so ends last one hook by  
 the ring Breaching Late in 43-20-44 75-50



## Saturday the 15

born with light winds from W employed  
 in cutting finished at 4 PM & traced forward  
 to N 8 W commenced hauling saw the  
 sail stern Middle Part little latter Part  
 the same at Meridian saw the whale lowered  
 & Chast but all in vain so ends in the late  
 43-31-44 75-20 W

## Sunday the 16

born with moderate gales from N 8 W &  
 steering by the wind lost Ruff topsail &  
 foresail at 4 PM saw 2 ships ahead the  
 ship to N 8 Middle Part little latter Part  
 the same saw 2 ships so ends in the late  
 43-20-44 75-20
