

On Chilkoot

December the 12 1895

Ran with Moderate gale from N.W. steering
by the wind N.E. spoke the Planter of Nantucket
1700 Middle and latter Part strong gale and
foggy so ends in the Lat 45-25 Long 76-12

Wednesday the 13

Ran with Moderate gale from N.W. steering
by the wind N.E. under short sail at dusk
took in all sail in company with the Planter
Middle Part foggy latter Ditto spoke the
Barfish bound home sent some letters got some
news and shades in the Lat 45-20 Long 77

Thursday the 14

Ran with Moderate gale from N.W. steering
by the wind S.W. under short sail Middle &
latter Part fine made all sail saw 3 ships
so ends in the Lat 45-28

Friday the 15

light winds & fine weather from W. and steering
by the wind N.E. at 2 P.M. were ship to S.W.
at 6 P.M. shortened sail Middle Part rising latter
Part Ditto saw nothing so ends in the Lat 45-32
Long 77-25

Saturday the 16

Ran with strong gale from W. steering by the wind
S.W. under short Reefed main topsail foggy
saw a whale Middle & latter Part foggy
spoke the water scott of Nantucket no oil
on board. The main topsail and reefed it and
bent it again so ends in the Lat 45-30 Long 77-37

December the 18 1895

Ran with strong gale from N.W. steering
by the wind N.E. under short Reefed topsails
bent the main topsail Middle Part ditto latter
Part the same the Island of Comias bore N.E.
Distance about 15 leagues so ends in the Lat 45-00
Long 78-30

Sunday the 19

Ran with strong gale from N.W. steering
by the wind N.W. under short Reefed topsails
Middle Part ditto latter Part fine saw Comias and
nothing more employed in repairing the old main
sail so ends in the Lat 44-25 Long 75-47

Monday the 20

Ran with light wind and fine weather from
N.W. steering N.W. for Harbo at 4 P.M.
sounded off Thomas 25 miles and found 200 fathoms
of water with blue mud at 6 P.M. double Reefed
the topsails and bore the main yard aback
and by all night headed N.W. Middle & latter
Part fine (Braced forward) to S.E. and made all
sail and spoke the Planter 1750 saw nothing bent
the main sail so ends in the Lat 43-52 Long 75-38

Tuesday the 21

With light winds from N.W. steering by the
wind N.E. under all sail at 6 P.M. shortened
sail Middle Part ditto latter Part fine under all
sail saw Comias so ends in the Lat 43-10 Long 75-30
