July the 28 1837

born with fine weather & steering
by the wind E under all sail at 1 PM
saw a number of the latter born
& at 2 PM looked up to SW at 4 PM
tackled & made out were ship to SW
at sight commenced sailing & at
10 PM set & beat in to Sulpapur after
fish and returned with some stores by the
wind E under all sail at 1 PM 1837

Saturday the 29

commenced with fine weather steering
by the wind E at 11 AM finished sailing
middle & latter part fine saw nothing
employed in setting up rigging & so end
in the Sald 1-57 1837

Sunday the 30

born with moderate gale from SE steering
by the wind E under all sail Middle &
latter part much the same saw nothing
and this days work in the Sald 1-58
1837

Monday the 31

born with moderate trade from SE by S
steering by the wind E by S under all sail
middle part ditto at 9 AM saw a number
whales lowered and chased so end
in the Sald 1-47 1837

August the 1st 1837

born with fine weather under all sail
in chasing whales at 8 PM the latter
part struck one and caught him took
him to the ship & called him double right
the top sail & braced forward by the wind
& by S Middle part equally latter part
ditto at day light commenced cutting &
at 10 PM braced forward to SW
so end in the Sald 1-28 1837

Wednesday the 2

born with moderate gale from SE steering
by the wind S SW commenced sailing and
at 4 PM wore ship to E middle and
latter part ditto saw nothing at
meridian finished in the Sald 1-30 1837

Thursday the 3

born with moderate gale from SE &
steering by the wind E SE under all sail
middle and latter part ditto saw nothing
employed in setting up the rigging
and so end in the Sald 2-02 1837

Friday the 4

born with moderate trade from SE and
steering by the wind E by S under all
sail Middle part & latter ditto saw
& sail standing to SW employed in setting
up rigging & so end in the Sald 1-31
