August the 21-1897
 born with light winds & steering in
 for trumpet and at 4 PM sent in the
 boat after the latter the Ontario
 which shot 300 Pacific Row before
 900 at 6 PM. Two ships of shore under
 all sail Middle & latter Part ditto
 saw nothing so ends in the Lat 2-45
 Long 81 W

Tuesday the 22
 born with moderate trade from S &
 steering by the wind WSW under all sail
 Middle and latter part ditto saw nothing
 so ends in the Lat 2-31 Long 82-52 W

Wednesday the 23-
 born with light wind from S and
 steering by the wind WSW under all sail
 at 4 PM hooked ship to S of Middle Part
 fire at 6 PM hooked ship to W by Soubert
 the mizen torn & sail and removed it & bent
 it again saw nothing so ends in the Lat 2-35

Thursday the 24
 born with light wind from SSW steering
 by the wind W by S under all sail at 2 PM
 saw a sail and at 6 PM spoke the William
 born of Stabmoorth 10 months 150 tons
 Middle and latter Part much the same
 so ends in Lat 2-20 Long 83-30 W

Course Journal

August the 25-1897
 born with light winds from S at meridian
 fore ship to WSW & at 4 PM spoke
 the William born and were to 8 PM
 Middle and latter part employed in repairing
 old sails so ends in the 2-07 Long 83-12

Saturday the 26
 born with light winds from S steering
 by the wind ESE under all sail at 5 PM
 saw breaches of the weather born Middle
 Part hooked ship to WSW and at 2 PM
 hooked to 8 PM saw 2 ships round in the
 Lat 2-15 Long 82-44 W

Sunday the 27
 born with moderate gale from S steering
 by the wind ESE under all sail at 2 PM
 saw whales and towers and the Hunt
 boat struck and caught 2 back then to
 the ship & cut them in 2 and forward by
 the wind ESE under all sail Middle Part hooked
 ship to WSW latter Part saw nothing
 commenced boiling rounds in the Lat 2-05
 Long 82

Monday the 28
 born with light wind from S steering
 by the wind ESE under all sail Middle
 Part finished boiling latter Part foggy
 saw nothing so ends in the Lat 2-30
