

Remarks continued

August the 29 1897

Left with foggy weather steering by the wind S 8 under all sail commenced heaving out the fore block & the fore peak to stow down oil Middle and latter Part with fine employees in stowing down oil saw fish heads 20 ends in the Sails 9-10

Wednesday the 30

Left with moderate gale & fine weather wind at S 8 W & steering by the wind S 8 under all sail at 4 PM saw the land at 6 AM tacked off shore 4 Middle Part fine the Part tacked in shore S 8 finished stowing down 20 ends in the Sails 2-54

Sgd 2-1225

Thursday the 31

Left with moderate gale from S 8 W and steering by the wind S 8 under all sail Middle Part tacked off shore & at 2 PM tacked in shore at 10 AM saw blackfish & lowered 4 boats & caught 6 took them to the ship & hoisted them in 20 ends in the Sails 9-10

Ship Edward Journal 35

September the 1 1897

Left with moderate gale from S 8 W & steering by the wind S 8 under all sail employed in cleaning the blackfish and Middle Part tacked off shore and at 2 PM tacked in shore saw cape Blanco bearing S by E distance 4 miles of 20 ends Sails 9-10

Sgd 20-10

Saturday the 2

Left with moderate gale from S 8 W & steering by the wind S 8 under all sail and at 4 PM tacked off shore W by S at 5 PM tacked the current found it to run S W Middle Part strong gale took in fore & main top of sail latter Part with boiling 20 ends

Sails 9-10 - Sgd 80-40

Sunday the 3

Left with moderate gale from S steering by the wind S 8 W under all sail at 2 PM finished boiling middle and latter Part fine saw nothing 20 ends in the Sails 4-54

Sgd 20-10

Monday the 4

Left with light breeze from S steering by the wind S 8 W under all sail Middle & latter Part with 20 ends nothing employed in cleaning the ship to 20 ends in the Sails 4-10 - Sgd 85-40
