September the 5-1839
 here with moderate gale from SE and
 steering by the wind S by E under all sails
 1500 took in top & sails Middle and
 latter Part fine saw nothing employed in
 painting in the late 5-40
 Laid 5-40

Wednesday the 6
 here with moderate gale and squally from
 SE steering by the wind S by E at 4 AM
 took in the main sail Middle and latter
 Part latter were ship to 500 saw
 blackbirds in the late 6-20 Laid 6-20

Thursday the 7
 here with moderate gale & squally
 steering by the wind S by E employed in
 painting between 2 gales Middle Part
 squally latter Part much the same saw
 nothing in the late 7-53 Laid 7-53

Friday the 8
 here with moderate gale from SE and
 squally steering by the wind S by E under
 sail Middle and latter Part saw blackbirds
 employed in painting the lower mast
 and 20 ends in the late 4-55

September the 9 1839
 here with light winds from SE and steering
 by the wind S by E under all sail Middle &
 latter Part fine employed in painting the
 Sails 20 ends in the late 4-58 Laid 4-58

Sunday the 10
 here with light winds from S by E steering
 by the wind S under all sail Middle &
 latter Part Sails saw nothing 20 ends
 in the late 4-50 Laid 4-50

Monday the 11
 here with light winds from S by E steering
 by the wind S under all sail at 2 PM
 spoke the schooner of London 500 at 2 PM
 the U.S. schooner enterprise spoke us
 & gave us information about the war
 & showed her course for the Gallapagos
 Islands Middle Part fine latter Part were
 ship in store employed in repairing the
 mast in the late 4-40

Tuesday the 12
 here with fine weather about the foremast
 top sail & top sail & painted the yards
 Middle & latter Part fine at 10 AM saw ship
 to S by E saw fairbairns in the
 late 5-4
