January the 7-1838
 born with light wind from S E steering
 by the wind & S E under all sail at 1 PM
 spoke the Charles of London 800 bbls
 oil middle & latter part the same saw nothing
 in side in the late 12-22 S 4 34

Monday the 8
 born with fine weather wind at S E &
 steering by the wind under all sail middle
 & latter part saw nothing employed in
 repairing about 30 men in the late 11-57 S 4 22-2

Tuesday the 9
 born with fine weather wind at S E &
 steering by the wind & S E under all sail
 Middle part latter part saw yellow whale
 & hauled 3 boats & caught 2 saw 11 one
 took them to the ship & cabled them &
 the 3 minute part of duty so ends in the
 late 11-07 S 4 22-00

Wednesday the 10
 born with fine weather wind employed
 in cutting & at 4 PM finished cutting
 moved forward to 540 Middle Part took
 ship to N E latter part latter saw
 Blackfish so ends in the
 late 11-15 S 4 22-00

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January the 11-1838
 born with fine weather wind at S E steering
 by the N E under all sail at 3 PM commenced
 Boiling Middle Part latter part finished
 Boiling saw nothing so ends in the
 late 10-20 S 4 20-45

Friday the 12
 born with fine weather & calm headed in
 shore N E under all sail middle & latter part
 latter saw a schooner bound down in the bay
 off Annamora so ends in the late 9-32 S 4 20

Saturday the 13
 born with fine weather wind at S E and
 steering by the wind & S E under all sail
 Middle & latter part latter saw nothing
 so ends in the late 9-04 S 4 20

Sunday the 14
 born with fine weather wind at S E
 steering by the wind & S E under all sail
 Middle part latter part saw nothing so ends
 in the late 9-24 S 4 20

Monday the 15
 born with fine weather wind S E steering in
 shore by the wind under all sail at 4 PM
 looked of shore middle & latter part latter
 so ends in the late 9-54 S 4 20

Tuesday the 16
 born with fine wind at S E steering by
 the wind & S E under all sail middle
 and latter part much the same talked ship of
 here & saw the land & a big wave in the late
 9-54 S 4 20
