February the 4 1898
 born with light winds from WSW
 & steering SSE at 2 PM saw sperm
 whales lowered & chased but all in vain
 middle & latter part equally so and
 in the late 10-425 Log 80-05 1/4

Monday the 5
 born with fine weather at meridian
 the Washington 950 lbs steering by
 the wind S under all sail Middle part
 under short sail latter part with the
 main sail and wore ship to ESE saw nothing
 employed in cooping the oil so ends
 in the late 10-335 Log 80-20

Tuesday the 6
 born with strong gales from SE & steering
 by the wind ESE under easy sail & at 6
 PM wore ship to SSW Middle part fine
 latter part light wind from SE employed
 in stowing down oil in the after hold
 between decks so ends in the late 10-50

Wednesday the 7
 born with fine weather wind at SE
 steering by the wind SSW under all sail
 middle and latter part ditto employed
 in stowing down oil saw nothing
 so ends in the late 11-25 Log 80-30

Ship Edward Quennell

February the 8th 1898
 born with fine weather wind at ESE
 & steering by the wind SE under all
 sail Middle & latter part saw
 nothing so ends in the late 12-05
 Log 82-50

Friday the 9
 born with calm & squally air light
 winds employed in ships duty steering
 by the wind ESE under all sail saw
 blackfish so ends in the late 11-45
 Log 80-10

Saturday the 10th
 born with fine weather & light winds
 from ESE & steering by the wind
 under all sail at 8 PM wore ship to
 SE by S & hauls up the course all day
 last fine latter haul the wind ESE
 saw nothing so ends in the late 11-35
 Log 80-40

Sunday the 11
 born with fine weather wind at SE &
 steering by the wind ESE under all sail
 at 4 PM wore ship to SSW middle & latter
 part ditto saw nothing so ends in the
 late 11-145 Log 81-20

Monday the 12
 born with fine weather wind at S
 steering by the wind SSW under
 Middle & latter ditto saw no
 ends in the late 12-345
