

Remarks Onboard

November the 21-1852

moderate gale from NW steering N by E under  
easy sail middle part forenoon the land  
at 5 PM about 1000 sail latter part started  
at 11 PM saw nothing employed in repairing  
about in the late 41 South

Thursday the 22

commence with calm heading NW by the  
land 30 miles of thick part calm latter  
part wind at 11 AM & heading NW by  
& 11 AM more ship to N E & close kept  
the towards 30 ends in the late 40-50 S

Friday the 23

strong gale from N W by took in the  
forenoon & was ship to NW thick part  
with latter part more moderate made all  
sail saw the land & saw 2 sail so ends  
in the late 40-50 S by 44-00 W

Saturday the 24

commence with moderate gale from NW by  
steering by the wind at once all sail at 4 PM  
was ship to S by at 6 PM single sail the  
latter part with latter part was  
ship to N W wind at 9 PM & much at sail  
employed in repairing about 20 ends in the  
late 40-00 S

Remarks Onboard

November the 25-1852

commence with moderate gale from NW by  
steering by the wind at 11 PM under all sail saw  
bumpbacks toward 20 ends by 11 in rain  
middle part fine latter part saw Alaska  
& spoke the Columbia of New York  
1500 bbls so ends in the late 50-00 S

Monday the 26

strong gale from N steering for Alaska  
at 11 PM under all sail the wind NW by under  
close kept towards Alaska & latter part  
the same employed in repairing about 20 ends  
in the late 50-50 S by 00-00 taken

Tuesday the 27

moderate gale from N steering by the  
wind E by S under easy sail & spoke the George  
with 1500 bbls middle & latter part made  
the same so ends in the late 50-55 S

Wednesday the 28

moderate gale from S steering by the wind  
at 11 PM under all sail middle part fine  
latter made all sail & saw the Island of  
St. Marks saw bumpbacks & saw them  
so ends in the late 50 S
