

Journal at Sea June 5th 1843

- Monday blowing a gale of wind ship lying too under close reef main topsail and foretopmast staysail nothing in sight
- 2nd Tuesday blowing hard rat the foreail in the forenoon; it sail in sight ahead standing towards us in the afternoon we spoke her and she proved to be the ship Montano of Antucket; nothing in sight this day
- 3rd Wednesday cloudy weather and light breezes sail in sight off our lee bow standing the same way as we about noon we saw it nother sail on our lee quarter standing the same way
- 4th Thursday cloudy weather light breezes steering off only one sail in sight on our lee bow towards noon it cleared off fine
- 5th Friday fair weather and light breezes steering by the wind nothing in sight
- 6th Saturday cloudy weather and light breezes steering by the wind, nothing in sight except it scall porpoises latitude 30-37 North
- 7th Sunday dull and cloudy with fresh breezes at N. steering off by the wind nothing in sight except it scall of porpoises
- 8th Monday calm and cloudy steering off it was foggy in the afternoon nothing in sight except it scall of grampuses
- 9th Tuesday cloudy and foggy with fresh breezes steering off nothing in sight
- 10th Wednesday cloudy with fresh breezes steering by the wind; nothing in sight

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- 15th Thursday ^{on Japan} thick and foggy with fresh breezes steering by the wind nothing in sight
- 16th Friday fair weather and calm saw 5 whales in the morning but they was finbacks nothing else in sight except grampuses and porpoises
- 17th Saturday cloudy weather and fresh breezes steering W by S nothing in sight except several Grampuses
- 18th Sunday wet and dull weather with fresh breezes steering W by S nothing in sight
- 19th Monday cloudy in the morning with fresh breezes steering S by W but it cleared off in the afternoon and was fine and pleasant the rest of the day nothing in sight except it scall of blackfish
- 20th Tuesday fair weather and light breezes steering by the wind nothing in sight
- 21th Wednesday fair weather and fresh breezes steering by the wind nothing in sight except finbacks and it large scall of porpoises
- 22th Thursday cloudy weather and fresh breezes steering by the wind nothing in sight except two or three finbacks lat 31-36 N Long 148 53 W
- 23th Friday fair weather and light breezes steering by the wind nothing in sight except finbacks and porpoises
- 24th Saturday fair weather and fresh breezes steering by the wind nothing in sight except it scall of porpoises Long 149-43 West
- 25th Sunday fair weather and light breezes steering by the wind it sail in sight in the morning in the afternoon we spoke her she was the study St. Clarke of New port 31 months out 1100 bl sperm
