June 14th 1911 p.m. light breeze and haze weather all sails set at 7 clock short her down to low topsails let by. Several steamers & vessels in our company. end of day.

Thursday

June 15th 1911 p.m. light breeze from W all sails set course NNE at 7 clock taking on light sails watch employed on ship's duty. Several steamers and vessels in sight. end of day
Lat: 36.15 N Lon: 74.01 W

Friday

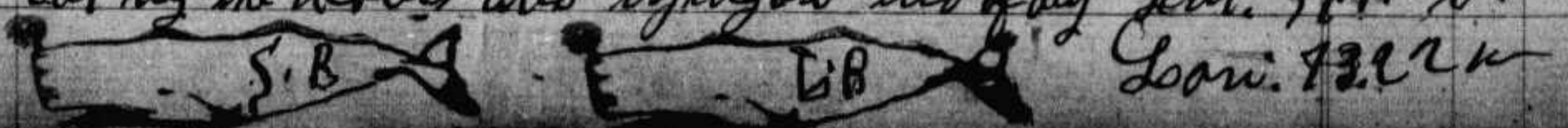
June 16th 1911 at. am light breeze and fine weather wind from W all sails set two schooners saw whals and got struck at 5:30 Captain saw a school of whals and lower down the boat's effort struck one second mate & third mate one fourth mate one and we got true at 10 clock end of day.

Saturday

June 17 1911 p.m. calm and fine clear weather employed finish cutting the whals & started to tryout the vessels and steamers in sight end of day.
Lat: 36.50 N Lon: 73.25 W

Sunday June 18th 1911 day began with light breeze and fine weather at 8 a.m. Mr. Brown saw school of whals we got Mr. Brown one Mr. Alameda one at p.m. took fog cutting the whals and trying out end of day
Lat: 37.11 N Lon: 73.22 W

June 19th 1911 p.m. calm and foggy weather watch employed tryout and stowed down some oil saw one steamer and one schooner end of day. ~~no~~ no observation

Tuesday

June 20th 1911 p.m. light breeze from W and foggy weather all sails set employed finish tryout and stowed down some oil saw lots steamers and vessels. at 7 clock wore ships to portward and short her down to low topsails end of day. Lat: 36.44 N Lon: 73.42 W

Wednesday

June 21st 1911 day began with light breeze and fine clear weather wind from N all sails set at 4:30 a.m. Mr. Brown saw a school of whals and drops down the boat's Mr. Brown struck one Mr. Alameda one came board cutting and laid gear down at 5 p.m. we saw them again. drop down the boat's but don't get any end of day. lots steamer by and one schooner get whal too.

June 22nd 1911 p.m. light breeze and fine weather wind from SW all sails set watch employed finish tryout and stowed down some of the oil. Several steamers & vessels in our company at 7 clock short her down to low topsails end of day
