

Remarks on the board Bark Bertha
July 1st 1911

day began with light breezes and fine weather at p.m. calm and tick. Three vessels and steamer in sight at 7 clock short her down to lower topsails and let lay. Watch employed on ship duty. John Joseph Connel returned to his duty. Will end of day. Lat: 36.29 N Lon: 73.32 W

Sunday

July 2nd 1911 a.m. calm p.m. light breeze from SW all sails set course W-SW saw 4 Schooners and steamer two of the Schooners got whals to day. watch employed on ship duty. Catches dolphins and lots little fish end of day
Lat: 36.36 N Lon: 73.08 W

Monday

July 3rd 1911 p.m. steady breezes from SW and fine clear weather at 5 a.m. Thos. Martin saw a school of whals and we been chasing all day. Mr. Edmunda struck one schooner T. Towner got 3 or 4 whals. three whaling Schooners in sight. Cutting the whal and short her down wore ships to W ward end of day. Lat: 36.47 N Lon: 73.20 W

Tuesday

July 4th 1911

p.m. light breezes and fine clear weather wind from SW all sails set employed finish tryout. saw 6 whaling Schooner and steamer. we gaining with T. Towner and Nickson end of day.
Lat: 37.00 N Lon: 73.29 W

Wednesday

July 5th 1911 p.m. light breezes and fine clear weather wind from SW all sails set employed stowed down oil 18 barrels saw 7 Schooners and two of them got whals today
Lat: 36.54 N Lon: 73.26

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Thursday

July 6th 1911 p.m. fresh breezes from SW all sails set at 8 a.m. captain saw a school of whals drop down the boats Mr. Edmunda struck one and Mr. Goncalves one came board late and started to cutting the whals Emanuel Antonio Edmunda Robert Vargas Brumalk Feranti p. Kroge refusing to work and captain put them in iron, and then they go to work cutting one whal and lots vessels in sight some of them got whals too Lat: 36.59 N Lon: 73.00 W

Friday

July 7th 1911

p.m. steady breezes and fine clear weather wind from SW ship cruising under topsails try out and cutting the whal saw two Schooner with boats down about 5 miles S.W. of us. at 8 p.m. wore ships to S ward tick. end of day. Lat: 36.50 N Lon: 72.56 W

Saturday

July 8th 1911 p.m. light breeze from SW all sails set employed finish tryout. 7 Schooners in sight 2 of them got whals today. and we gaining with Garlinton Bell and T. Towner and Nickson end of day
Lat: 36.40 N Lon: 72.41 W

Sunday

July 9th 1911 p.m. light breezes and fine weather wind from W all sails set at 10 a.m. schooner saw whals and we all drop down our boats but they went to windward never got any. 7 of Schooners was in sight employed stowed down oil 40 barrels end of day
Lat: 36.26 N Lon: 72.48 W
