Saturday

August 5th 1911 p.m. light breezes and squally with rain wind from S all sails set at 9 clock short her down to low top sails saw steamers and sail employed on ship duty. end of day. No observation sun obscure

Sunday

August 6th 1911 p.m. fresh breezes and clear weather wind from E ship on short sails saw lots steamers. employed on ship duty we coath lots fish. end of day
Lat: 37.20 N Lon: 73.46 W

Monday

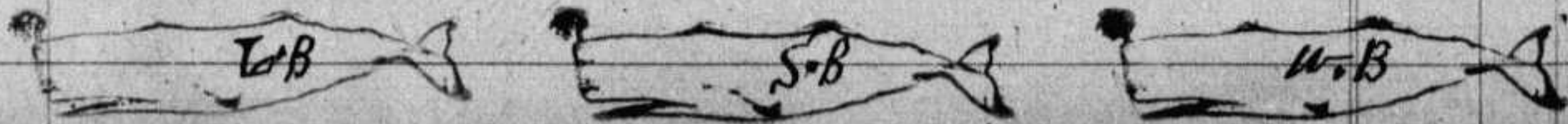
August 7th 1911 p.m. fresh breezes and fine clear weather wind from E all sails set close hauled watch employed on ship duty. saw nothing but steamers. end of day
Lat: 36.58 N Lon: 73.55 W

Tuesday

August 8th 1911 p.m. light breezes and fine clear weather wind from E all sails set watch employed on ship duty. saw nothing but steamer at 7 clock taking on gallant sails and courses. end of day Lat: 36.58 N Lon: 74.00 W

Wednesday

August 9th 1911 p.m. light breezes and fine clear weather wind from SW all sails set at 12 clock Antonio Suarez saw a school of whals and drop down boats Mr. Brown struck one Mr. Alameda one Mr. Goncalves struck 2 and lost one came board cutting the whals and set watch end of day
Lat: 36.56 N Lon: 73.46 W



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Thursday

August 10th 1911 p.m. light breezes and fine clear weather wind from W all sails set watch employed try out saw several steamers and vessels two schooners trying out at 7 clock taking on light sails. end of day. Lat: 37.11 N Lon: 73.32 W

Friday

August 11th 1911 p.m. steady breezes and fine clear weather wind from SW all sails set employed finish try out and stowed down saul oil saw steamer and two vessels and we gaming with schooner Carliton Bell. end of day. Lat: 37.20 N Lon: 72.57 W

Saturday

August 12th 1911 p.m. fresh NE wind and cloudy weather ship on short sails close hauled watch employed finish stowed down 47 barrel saw two schooners and steamers end of day. No observation sun obscure

Sunday

August 13th 1911 p.m. calm all day at 10 am. Mr. Alameda saw a school of whals and drop down the boats but dont get any. one schooner in sight. end of day.
Lat: 37.33 N Lon: 73.32 W

Monday

August 14th 1911 p.m. light breezes and fine weather wind from NE all sails set close hauled watch employed painting round. saw nothing but steamer end of day. Lat: 37.30 N Lon: 73.10 W
