Thursday 23^d Nov 1843

Light breeze for the first part middle and latter strong gales from the South East set the studding sails at 7^h PM at 11^h 30^m took them in main royal and flying jib at 7^h AM passed to leeward of a ship standing to the Westward under double reefed topsails and courses

Friday 24 Nov

This day commenced blowing strong middle and latter part heavy squalls from the South West with snow a tremendous sea running the ship labouring very heavy at 10^h AM double reefed the fore topsail furled the main sail and main royal

Blowing strong breezes throughout this day a heavy swell on from the South East

Thick weather and snow squalls strong breezes throughout this day

Blowing strong gales throughout this day at 11^h PM furled the top galen sails studding sails and flying jib at 6^h AM carried away the jib into ribbons very squally through the latter part

Tuesday 28 Nov 1843

Blowing very heavy squalls throughout this day a large sea running all sail set steering with the wind off the quarter the watch breaking out water and meat

Wednesday 29 Nov

Blowing heavy squalls through the first and middle part latter moderate with light breezes the watch employed getting up new studding sails and fore top mast staysail bending them rather sulky disagreeable times on board between the Captain and me I believe he thinks I do not use him as he ought to be used but I have done my utmost and cannot get along so we must go on until we arrive in port

Thursday 30 Nov

Light breeze through the first and middle part latter strong breezes and clear weather at 5^h AM the wind hauled to North West the watch employed putting ropes on the sails

Friday 1 Dec

Commenced with clear pleasant weather moderate breeze middle and latter part blowing a strong gale from the North West with very heavy squalls at 9^h 40^m PM furled the royal flying jib and studding sails at 12^h took in the top galen sails jib up anchor and double reefed the topsails at 8^h close reefed the fore topsail at 10^h AM furled the main sail and fore topsail blowing very heavy squalls off the land
