Monday 12 Feb 1844

First and middle parts of this day very squally latter part the wind hauled round to south and with a light breeze thick rainy weather at 5h carried the main top sail out of the bolt rope and it up and unbent it bent another the watch employed repairing it at 6h ~~it~~ unbent the main sail and repaired it bent it again

Tuesday 13 Feb

Blowing heavy gales through this day from the south and East and North East a heavy thunder storm in the south West lying too from 1h AM to 7h 30 AM then made sail the weather more moderate

Wednesday 14 Feb

Clear weather and a moderate breeze through the first part middle part calm latter part a light breeze from the south West with clear pleasant weather unbent the main top sail and bent another broke out water

Friday 16 Feb

This day commenced clear and blowing strong gales middle part at 2h AM a heavy thunder storm passed over blowing a living gale of wind from the North West which struck the ship all aboard took in all sail but the fore top mast stay sail lasted for three hours at day light put sail on the ship had to call all hands to shorten sail

Cloudy weather with light breezes from the North West through this day find the ship in the gulph stream and the water very warm a current setting the ship five miles per hour to the Eastward
