Wednesday 12 June 1844

Blowing strong gales through to the first part middle & latter more moderate at 2h PM furlled the mizzen top sail at 7h set it and shoot the reefs out of the main top sail all hands employed on deck

Blowing strong gales throughout this day furlled the top galen sails single reefed the mizzen top sail put out a new Boat for the 1st mates and secured the stores until better weather

Saturday 15 June

Blowing a heavy gale with thick weather at 7h double reefed the top sails at 10h PM furlled the fore & mizzen top sails spanker gill & main sail at 9h AM furlled the fore sail & close reefed the main top sail hoisted up the boats at 12h Blowing very heavy with a tremendous sea running

Blowing heavy gales throughout this day with thick foggy weather lying too under close reefed main top sail and spanker

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Monday June 17th 1844

Still blowing heavy the wind hauls round to North make sail and steer to the Eastward a very heavy head beat sea running the ship pitching jibboom under all hands employed on deck set up the top galen rigging and jib stay the wind continues hauling to the Westward several of the crew still very sea sick and home sick

First part blowing strong gales from the West & South West middle part light air with clear pleasant weather first part heavy rains all hands variously employed
